CFA News - seasonal fire restrictions

To many people, fire restrictions may seem to be confusing and unnecessarily restrictive however they are only imposed after careful evaluation of conditions by experts with input from all the local brigades.

In recent years we have had a number of serious fires in our area caused by burn offs lit in what seemed to be reasonable conditions. But weather conditions can change rapidly and fires be out of control in no time.

There are two levels of fire restrictions

1. Municipal Restrictions. This year they came into force on 15 October. Small fires are allowed in rural areas (but not urban). Occasionally the Shire may declare an amnesty that permits small rubbish fires in urban areas. No windrows, stumps or material over 75mm can be lit. anywhere without a permit during the Municipal Restriction period.

Fires can only be lit in the open with a permit issued by the Municipal Fire Prevention Officer or by the CFA District Office. "Fires" include Kerosene flares on bamboo poles, paper lanterns, candles etc. Note that severe penalties apply. Slashing dry paddocks is permitted but tractors etc. must be in good mechanical condition and carry fire suppression equipment. Note that this means all machinery including ride on mowers.

Be very careful with angle grinders and welders.

Remember always notify Vicfire (1800 668 511) of your planned burn to avoid unnecessary callouts.

Rainfall at Acheron

Over the last three months welcome spring rain has been filling our dams and promoting new growth.

Acheron's average yearly rainfall over the last twenty three years has been 725mm. In 2014 we are unlikely to receive this much rain.

So far this year we have received 627.5 mm. This is quite a lot more than in 2013 but we will need to get 98mm of rain in December to reach the average.



Not impossible but unlikely. It did happen in 1992 and in 2010.

It's interesting to note that on the official rainfall map as published by the Commonwealth Bureau of Meteorology, Acheron is placed in the area which receives 1000mm of rainfall each year, based on average rainfalls as recorded over the period 1961 to 1990.

Do you think that it's time that this chart was updated?
