President's Report - March 2015

A utumn is here and we are grateful that Acheron has survived the worst of the hot weather. An unusual summer without the extremes of high temperature going into the mid 40s that we had the previous summer. Marginally more rain, but distributed more evenly between

December and February.

Our CFA was involved in two local fires on successive days in mid December and Acheron witnessed the water bombers in action.

The Hall Committee is investigating the purchase of a defibrillator. It would be located in the Hall and available if an emergency occurred whilst the Hall was in use. This defibrillator is in addition to the Acheron CFA's project.

An issue that all Acheron residents should be aware of is the scheduled release of water from Lake Eildon as part of the Murray Darling Basin Plan for proposed environmental water flows. The amount of water to be released could see the Goulburn River flow raised to as much as 20,000 mega litres per day. The impact on resident's homes, businesses and pasture lands in the Upper Goulburn catchments could be devastating. The backing up of the Acheron River caused by this amount of water flowing down the Goulburn River could flood the Acheron Valley, creating a 'Lake Acheron'. Our Hall could be inundated.

This issue is a Federal & State Government project with Victoria being a party to returning water to the Murray River for environmental use. This water can be supplied from Lake Eildon and collateral damage to landowners needs to be managed. Although this water release is some years away the mitigation policies are being decided now.

To protect our local interests we all need to make our voices heard on this issue!

Grass fire at Acheron

On Monday 15th of December, the first of two local fires occurred due to lightning strike. Three local tankers, including Acheron, plus two slipons and a fixed wing aircraft water bomber attended, putting out the blaze. The fire was on what's known locally as Two Tree Hill, actually Womersleys Hill, the largest hill in the area, above Squires Road. The tankers drove to the very top of the hill. The large photo shows the Acheron tanker descending the hill to extend the reach of the fire hoses, so the Acheron CFA members can reach the fire with the water.

Early Connelly homestead painting

Earlier this year the ACH Committee received an email from Ian Leader-Elliott of South Australia, who wrote. *I have a connection with the district. Thomas Connelly was my great grandfather. I have a copy of a painting, done sometime in the 1940s, of the Connelly house, long since demolished.*

Thomas Brown Connelly (1835-1914) settled at Acheron around 1864/5 and his sons farmed in the district. My great grandfather, Thomas Connelly, left Acheron and settled at 'Inverell', Gobur. The painting is supposed to have been done by a local school teacher - Leon Parfrey in 1943. The gum tree shown in the painting is still standing, though the homestead is long gone.'

The tree is in McColl Lane, and is readily identified from the painting.

Below is an extract from -Acheron: a history of the district.

The name Connelly is best known in Acheron for the creek and the road named after it. The name Connelly comes from Thomas Connelly, one of Acheron's earliest selectors who selected the land around the mouth of the creek where it flows into the Acheron River. Thomas Connelly is also known for his gift to the community in 1913 of a quarter of an acre of land on which to build the Acheron Mechanics' Institute and Free Library.
