At the time of writing this report it has raining on and off for the past week. This is good news. We need to top up the water tanks for summer and autumn. But we have had less rain this year than last

and whilst the soil is still quite saturated, we should be aware of the differences - 758.8mm compared to 910.7mm for Jan-Oct 2010. (rainfall measured on eastern side of Acheron River)
